ASAP Advocate (volunteer)

To provide advocacy and crisis intervention to UNC victims/survivors of sexual assault, intimate partner violence, and stalking.

- 1. Complete 40 hours of mandatory training
- 2. Complete on-going/in-service training as scheduled
- 3. Provide two weeks of 24-hour on-call crisis support
- 4. Provide crisis intervention to victims/survivors and concerned others
- 5. Arrange appropriate referrals
- 6. Provide adequate and appropriate follow-up to victims/survivors and concerned others
- 7. Attend weekly advocate meetings
- 8. Provide support at ASAP events and other outreach opportunities
