# Johnston as City Leader

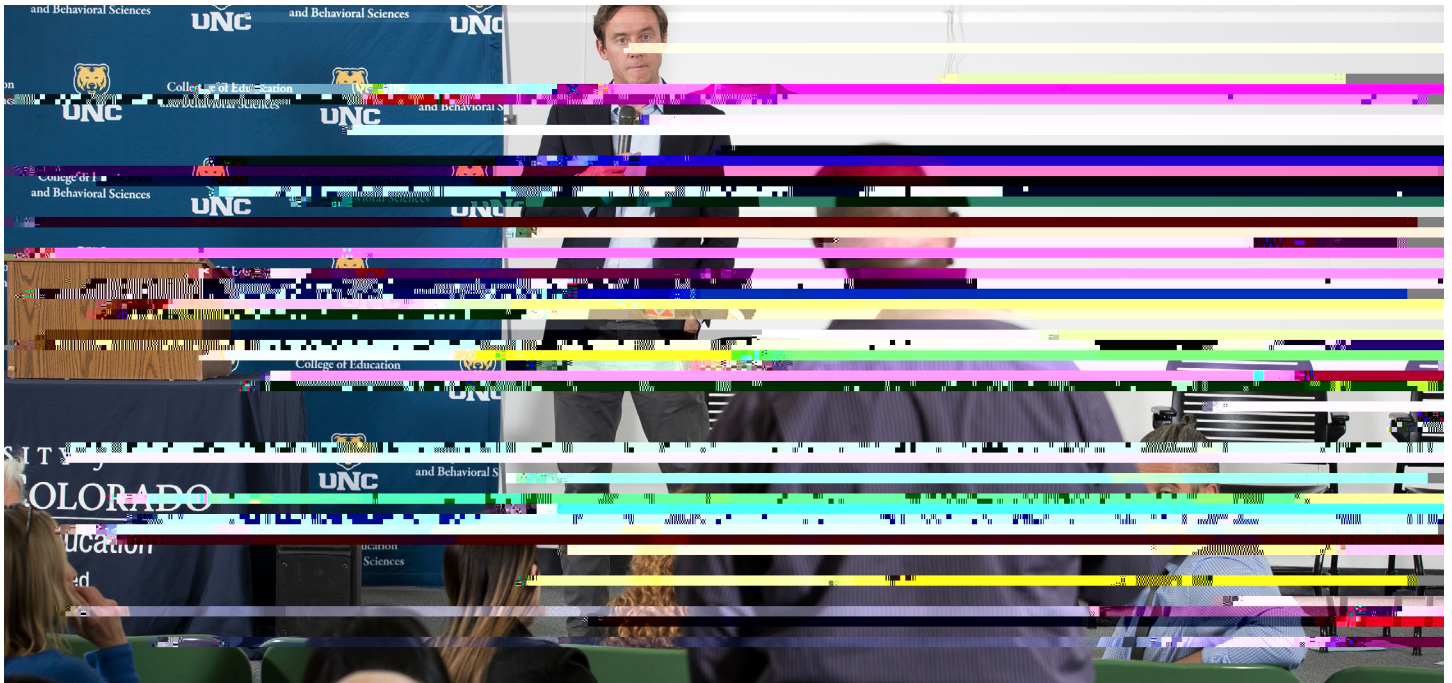
