Vaughan presenterevisions to the posthumous degrees policy meant to symplif the process and provide more flexibility for awarding posthumous degrees Key changes to the policy:

*f*Family approval is no longer required to award a posthumous degree.

- *f*The requirement that a student must have been enrolled in their last semester before graduation has been removed.
- *f*The CAQ in consultation with the Dean of Students, determines whether the posthumous degree will be awarded.

MOTION: APC –It is moved to approve the revised Posthumous Degrees policy for placement in University Regulations and in University Catalogs.

DISCUSSION:

The phrases "reasonable progressard degree completionand 'significant disciplinary incident" were written to be intentionally vague to allow the CAO and DOS to use their discretion when considering individual cases.

The policy as written covers students what ynn ot be enrolled inlasses at the time of their death (e.g., students who have take and of a sence would be eligie). President Feinsteithanked the committee for their work and is supportive of the policy as written.
